Environmental Determination

This Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND)/Environmental Assessment (EA) evaluates the 2 3 impacts of implementing the 2-Gates Demonstration Project (2-Gates Project, or Project) in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the National 4 Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The Project would be located in the Sacramento-San Joaquin 5 River Delta (Delta), which is a vital source of drinking water for 25 million Californians and 6 7 supports more than 1.3 million acres of irrigated agricultural lands. The 2-Gates Project would install and operate removable gates in two key channels in the central Delta (Old River and 8 9 Connection Slough) for a five-year period in order to control flows and thereby help reduce entrainment of delta smelt (Hypomesus transpacificus) at the State Water Project and Central 10 Valley Project export pumps. 11 Reclamation is the lead agency under NEPA and is responsible for determining the scope and 12 13 content of the EA. Reclamation will issue a Finding of No Significant Impact based on the analysis in the EA.
