




How to Geolocate and Map a Project Page

Welcome to the Geolocate and Map a Project Page video tutorial.


In this tutorial, we will go through the steps to assign coordinates to a project page on Bay-Delta Live.

First, find the project you would like to map.


To access the project page library, click on the “Projects” link in the top bar.




Then click on “Search” in the sub-navigation.




Once you find the project page you would like to map, hover over the Tools menu and choose, "Edit."




The metadata editor form pops up. This is where you can enter or edit the metadata for the project page.




Click on the “Map It!” tab.



You can enter the latitude and longitude coordinates of the location of the research or restoration project. For instance, enter the coordinates for Wallace Weir for the Wallace Weir Improvement Project.




If you don't have the specific coordinates, click "Open Map" to use the map function to select the location.



Once you select a location on the map, the latitude and longitude coordinates will show in the form.

Click "save changes."



As long as the project page is public, it will show up on the project library map so people can search using geolocation.
